Dear parents, caregivers and friends of the school

As the term draws to a close with the seniors completing their benchmark exams, we can look back on an eventful term with the full range of school activities from the hugely successful production "Rock of Ages" to the many sporting tournaments and exchanges to a number of academic competitions such as the Science Fair and Maatangi Whenua. Throw in Parent-Teacher interviews, an Old Boys' reunion, the Hospitality classes' Café and a school ball and sports dinner among other events and the big picture is clearly apparent.

The recent winter tournament week featured some mixed fortunes from our top sides but the highlights came from basketball and football primarily. The junior basketball side went unbeaten through their national tournament beating Scots College comprehensively

in the final, while the Premier side has qualified for nationals later this month. In football, our 2nd XI was third in their tournament in New Plymouth, while the 1st XI finished 8th in the country after a great early run. Not to be outdone, the Junior team also finished 8th at the Hillsdene National U15 tournament in Tauranga. Youthful hockey sides fought hard with all

games being extremely close; the 1sts earned the right to stay in the top tier for 2018 which was a victory on its own. U15 rugby, while out of contention after pool play, finished strongly and earned plaudits off the field for their manner. In other news, the board noted the 16 submissions it received on the proposed changes to the school uniform. It has voted to implement these changes and a full outline is contained later in the newsletter. On the property front, the board has been presented with several options for the school's masterplan which allows for the replacement of the Armour Block. This process will be completed by November and detailed design of that block will then commence; groups of students have been surveyed as part of this design process.

We also held a Cybersafety presentation for parents and whanau hosted at school last week. It is our intention to offer several of these events each year in conjunction with the Parents' League. I would welcome suggestions from the parents on topics you would find valuable in the future.

Finally, I wish all the boys a relaxing and

safe holiday break, remembering that the NCEA exams come on quickly in term four and that the two weeks offer a valuable time for reflection on bench mark exam performances and final preparation for November's external examinations.

Changes To The School Uniform Policy

The Board of Trustees discussed the recent consultation regarding proposed changes to the uniform policy. There were 6 submissions received opposing compulsory shoes and socks all year round while 2 submissions were supportive of this change. Furthermore, 8 submissions opposed changes to the shirts based on a variety of reasons including the style, fabric, lack of "class", health and safety among others.

All submissions were presented to the Board and discussed at length. The Board wishes to thank those who made their views known; it should be noted that the decision regarding changes to the footwear, in particular, was made neither lightly nor easily. The following decisions were made:

The school uniform policy be amended as follows:

- Approved footwear will be black leather shoes and school socks; sandals will no longer be permissible footwear. This applies all year and starts in Term Four this year.
- A new long sleeved winter weight Kukri-branded shirt replaces the long sleeved black shirt. This change comes into effect for all year 9 students from 2018.
- A new short sleeved summer Kukribranded shirt replaces the light blue airtex shirt. This change comes into effect for all year 9 students from 2019.

The first game was Vs Wainuiomata College on Saturday which we won convincingly 107-29, later on Saturday we played Aotea College and beat them 84-44. The next day on Sunday our first game was against New Plymouth Boys and we beat them 99-80. After that game we played Francis Douglas College and beat them 104-52. We finished the top of our pool after those wins and on Monday our first

game was against Wellington College in the quarter finals and we beat them 105-60. Our next game was a big game vs Palmerston North Boys' High School in the semi, but still won convincingly 109-69 scoring 93 points in 3 quarters of the game. The next day we played in the finals vs Scots College who had not lost a game either, but the final score was 99-79 us winning by 20 points On YuQing Jiang's historic 67 point game scoring 48 points in the first half.







New Zealand Secondary Schools' Badminton Championship

NBHS entered the 2017 Championship as a development opportunity and to support the local badminton association. Heading in to the Division 2 Championship we were ranked tenth in a field of twenty teams. This position ultimately placed us into a very competitive box with NZ's largest secondary school Rangitoto College, Auckland Grammar 2, Bethlehem College and fellow Super 8 school New Plymouth Boys' High School (NPBHS). Having drawn with NPBHS 3-3 on matches, but winning on games during Super 8 in July, it was clear from the start that our initial round robin was going to be tough. Rangitoto College and Auckland Grammar 2 ultimately went on to place third and fifth in Division 2, respectively. Our win over NPBHS knocked them into the playoff for 17-20th position and placed us fourth in the box which put us in the playoff for 9th -16th. Our results in order of play were:

Our final game against South Island team Waitaki Boys' was a playoff for 13th and 14th position. It was described as "epic" by the opposing team's manager. All members of our team battled away to ensure that we would either have an advantage with games won, or if it came to it, a count back on points. As detailed above, the tie was drawn on matches and games. It ended with both teams' players huddled around the manager's table as a count back on points was calculated and double checked. There was a brief NBHS celebration when the tallying confirmed that we had won by 12 points.



Both Leeam Tang and William Hollis performed strongly throughout the tournament. In the playoff round they were ranked 5th and 7th respectively on matches and games won, and points attained, from a large field of 37 players. Their player statistics were:

All up, the Championship was a steep learning curve but provided a great development opportunity for our players in preparation for next year's Super 8 Tournament.
