**START ON
9 NOVEMBER 2016**

ALL NCEA (levels 1 - 3) and New Zealand Scholarship examination sessions are three hours. All exam sessions start at either 9.30 am or 2.00 pm.

From The Headmaster's Office

I trust you all enjoyed the long weekend break and that our seniors used some of this time to focus on final assessments or exam preparation. Now is the time, more than any other during the year, to sacrifice a few of the pleasures in exchange for hard work. There will be plenty of time for relaxation after the portfolios are submitted and the examinations completed.

Soon our senior students will leave the school for the last time; when they return it will be as old boys and supporters of the school. Our leavers depart to a varied range of post-school

training and study and this follows well-established patterns over the last few years with 71% indicating they will attend study at a tertiary level, with 51% looking to go outside the Hawke's Bay to do so. 7% will go onto apprenticeships or vocational careers' training; 7% intend entering the workforce, some to save for future study; 7% will have a GAP year travelling, while a further 7% will enter the Defence Forces or Police.

As part of this focus on life outside of school, we held a successful and well-attended "Sons going on to tertiary study" evening presented by

our Careers' Advisor, Ms Carola Laurs. What is clear from all the tertiary providers is the extra emphasis placed on the pastoral care and mentoring of young students. This change has been occurring over many years but your sons today can expect much greater wrap around support than our generation received. They only need access it.

You will be receiving notice of your son's benchmark examination results within the next week. This will give you a guide as to their expected performance in November. In some cases it will reveal what they don't know; the good news, there is time for them to rectify that both through personal study and in class time.

There is no need to wish our seniors luck for their examinations; they will have created their own luck through hard work and perseverance. These characteristics are vital components for academic improvement irrespective of

ability and I am sure will be rewarded come mid-January 2017 when final results are released.

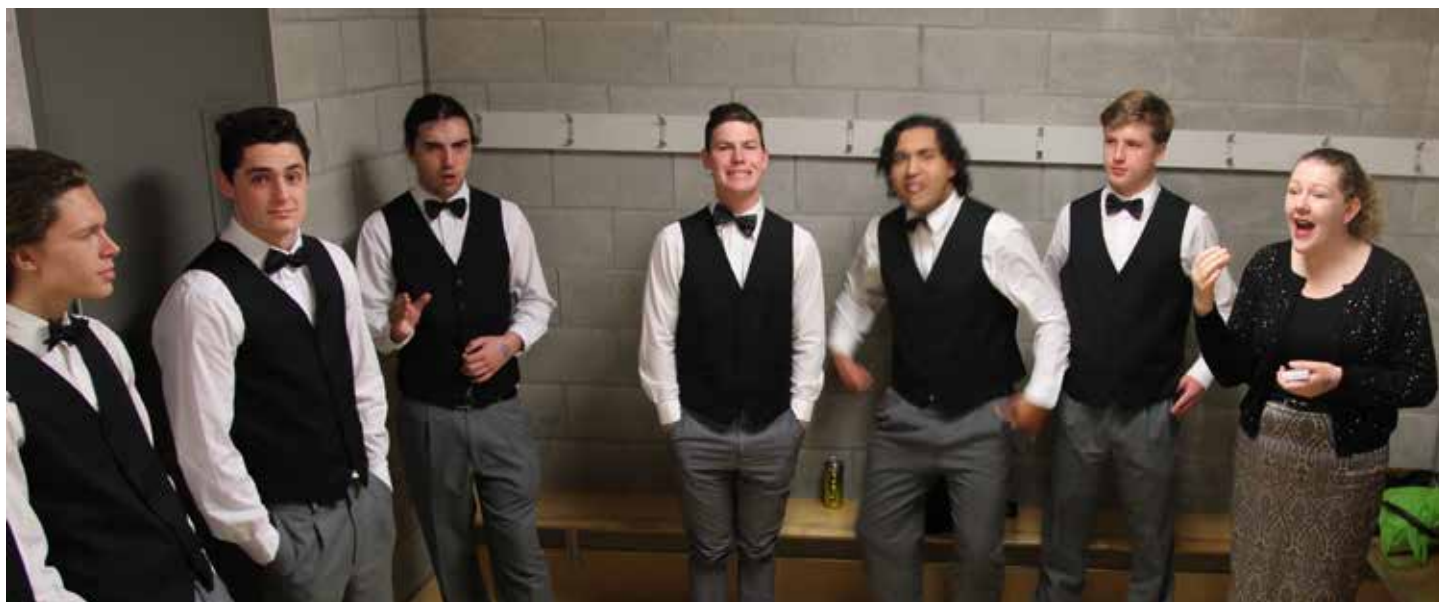

Barbershop



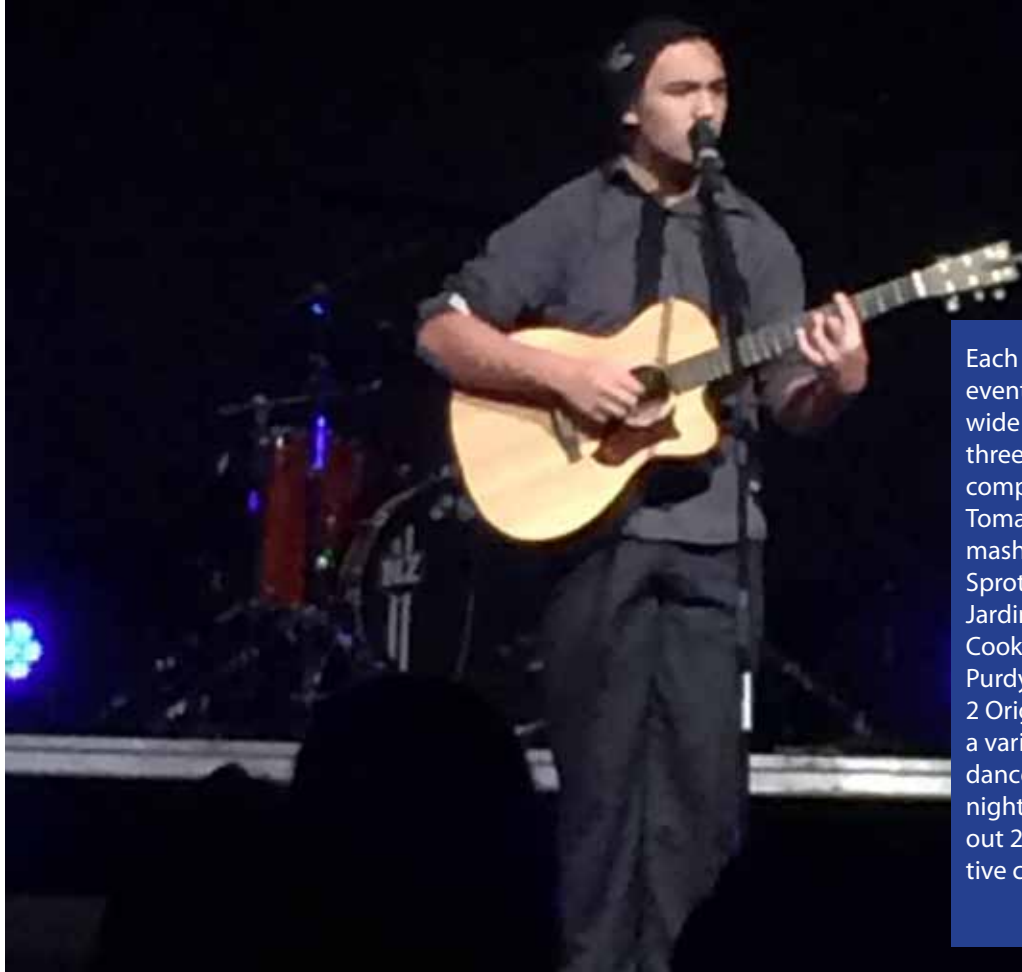
It's been a busy year for the Choir as we also tried our hand in the Regional Barbershop Competitions held at NGHS in August. There are 2 categories of competition, 1 for quartets and 1 for Chorus' (Teams). A Chorus must have a minimum of 12 singers across 4 vocal lines and sing a ballad and an up tune. We competed against Hastings Boys' &

St. John's and gained third place, but more excitingly, qualified for Nationals!

On September 14-15 we travelled down to Porirua to compete against 6 other qualifying Boys' Barbershop groups. Day 1 all the quartets competed and we were able to cheer on the 3 Quartets from Hastings Boys' along with 1 from

Napier Girls'. Day 2 saw us draw second in the line-up but, competing as the first Boys' group. The level of competition was very high, not only do they have to sing unaccompanied and in four parts but, incorporate movement and choreography. Our Boys' performed outstandingly and are currently placed 7th in New Zealand.

Each year Zeal hosts a variety of events including a Hawkes Bay wide Talent Quest. This year saw three acts from NBHS enter and compete for Gear and Cash prizes. Tomairangi Henare sang a great mash up, while FYVEYES (Keegan Sprott, Jackson Ranapiri & Louis Jardine) and Critical Theory (Oliver Cook, Ben Cornes, Joe Cornes, Sam Purdy & Felix Landon) Performed 2 Original songs each. There were a variety of acts from Singers to dance groups and at the end of the night our Critical Theory boys' took out 2nd place in a highly competitive competition.

Model Expo

It's not often that visitors to a show are greeted by a World War One 18 pounder gun of the artillery brigade, but this year a 2 ton replica of such a gun was positioned in the gymnasium foyer for people to marvel at. It was built by Sir Peter Jackson for his film 'War Horse' and was loaned to the school for the occasion by 'The Gilbert Commemorative Battery', a group based in Hastings. Once inside the show visitors enjoyed the displays brought alive by hobbyists from all over the North Island. Particularly popular was the life-size replica of a World War Two Lancaster Bomber Gun Turret, built by local engineer Alex Smith. Mr Smith was also responsible for the large Space Shuttle now sitting in the school's planetarium. A plethora of other activities including radio-control trucks, Tamiya cars, boats in the pool, radio control helicopters whirling around the gymnasiums, dolls houses, model railways, war gaming, bonsai trees, model car and truck displays and



competitions. Particularly interesting were the 'scratch-built' models of Paul Franco, showing that there can be real satisfaction from actually creating something that works and looks right and real, rather than just pressing a few buttons on a screen and seeing virtual reality. There was nothing 'virtual' about

this year's model expo, it was all real. The Japan Tour Group is grateful to all of the exhibitors and sponsors who kindly assisted by putting on displays at the show, and to the public of Hawkes Bay who attended and made the fundraiser a very profitable success.

Held in October these races were run over a road and limestone course at the Regional Sports Park. On the day we had 4 athletes out through illness so our team results, were not as good as we had hoped, but there were some outstanding individual efforts.

Oliver Marshall continued with his outstanding form winning the Year 9

race by 34 seconds and breaking the existing record. Oliver ran 9:43 for the 3 kilometre course. Max Taylor was second in a time of 10:17 that in most years would have won this race. Adam Barron ran his best race of the year to finish 5th. This gave us a points total of 8 the next best team was Gisborne Boys' on 32 so the boys smashed the competition.

Bradley Christison was the other stand out individual. Bradley has struggled with form this season but ran his best race of the year to win by 46 seconds. He ran the 6 kilometre course in 19:30 to break the existing record and re-establish himself near the top on middle distance running in New Zealand.

NZSS Chess Championship 2016

Having won the Hawke's Bay Team Chess Championship by winning 20 of 20 games, we represented the region at the NZSS Chess Championship. But we were under no illusions; our team of Charlie Li, Daniel Kim, Cam Penman and Harry Champion knew we were small fish swimming in a much bigger pond. However, the luck of the draw would work for us.

Each one of our players recorded some strong results on the first day. We began with a heavy loss to Otago Boys' where we managed a single draw. Round

2 was a close win over Super 8 rivals Gisborne by 2.5-1.5. We then knocked over Christchurch champions Riccarton by 3-1 before being hammered by top seed (and eventual winners) Westlake Boys' 0-4.

Day two started with a win against Spotswood, again by 3-1. Then we met perennial powerhouse Macleans College, where we again were trounced. This is where the luck of the draw favoured us. We were tied with Otago and Hamilton Boys' but they were drawn against top four teams and we

found ourselves facing Bay of Plenty's Bethlehem College. We score a 4-0 victory to rise above the other two, who each lost heavily.

I took a photo of the table after three rounds when we were fifth, saying, "We won't be there for long." In fact, that's exactly where we finished – 5th of 14 teams. This was especially pleasing because we had been seeded 12th. This was our best ever placing and we were the best non-Auckland team.
