



Government donation scheme

The Government announced that the \$150 donation per student for school's decile 7 and below will take effect from 2020. This will remove the ability of schools to ask for a general donation, or for a specific donation towards many curriculum-related activities. Boards of Trustees need to signal their intention later next month. Our Board is considering this strongly given the steady decline in the general school donation over the past five years. For our school, which is decile 6 and relatively large, this is not necessarily a "win-win" scenario as it places restrictions on the specific curriculum donations and fees previously charged. This could mean a rationalisation of the offerings in subject areas which have expensive resources (e.g.: technologies) or expensive field trips. The Board remains committed to providing as full and rich curriculum as possible so this year's school budget will be closely examined in light of the impending donation scheme decision. What is clear, extracurricular activities – culture, sport and our camp at year 10 (which is optional) – are discretionary and fees will continue to be charged for participation.

NZ SECONDARY SCHOOL SWIMMING

WATERWORLD TE RAPA HAMILTON 12-15 SEPTEMBER 2019

NBHS swimmers left for the NZ Secondary School Swimming Champs on Thursday 12 Sept. 750 competitors and 160 schools entered.

The 13-man team did really well gaining a 12th place overall. Matthew Sexton scored 40 individual points and Ryan Hurley 24 individual points by being placed in the top 8 in their age group per event. Ryan and Matthew just missed out on medals gaining 4th and 5th placings in their favoured races. The highlight were the relays where our seniors did us proud but once again we missed out on medals by 100th of seconds!! The whole event was live streamed including the opening ceremony which was exciting for all the competitors.

All boys represented the School well. A giant thank you goes out to our captain Reid who lead the team and took many photos and videos throughout.

Term 4 Summer Uniform



Thank you for sending your young men to school in the correct school uniform. It is a requirement of the school. Correct summer uniform is a short sleeve shirt (years 12 & 13 have a senior shirt they are entitled to wear), navy shorts, socks & black leather shoes. School caps with the school crest are the only caps permitted to be worn on school grounds.

A reminder that uniform can be paid for in advance at the school office during opening hours (or via internet banking) so parents do not need to

be concerned about sending boys to school with cash – it is not necessary for parents to be present at the uniform shop as our staff will outfit students.

All hire uniform should now be back at school. Anyone who has not returned their hire are being charged at REPLACEMENT COST.

Grey trousers will no longer be available for hire in 2020. If your son plays for a top grade, sporting team or part of a performance group (including Kapa Haka etc) they will need to buy grey trousers, white shirts & a school tie for the 2020 year.


Napier Boys' High School Parent League



