# Nathan Wallis

On Thursday November 28th we hosted Nathan Wallis. He educated us on human brain development and how it relates to us as teachers and to other and ourselves as parents.

Some lessons:-

Teenagers' brains effectively "close for renovations" some time in their teenage years. This can make them hard to talk to and very difficult to understand lots of the time. Don't panic – it's normal!!

Males generally reach maturity between 24 and 32. That means there's plenty of time for "the man your son will become" to emerge!

When the brain is "closed for renovation" boys generally spend about 90% of his time each day feeling emotional. Trying to talk when he's like that is like trying to talk to a drunk!! Your better to wait until he's able to think!

The way the brain operates, the more your son

feels stressed, the more he's able to think. The less he feels stressed, the less he's able to think. So, when your boy is stressed, he needs to feel like his emotions and thoughts are being accepted and validated. The time for advice and learning is much later.

Alcohol and marijuana cause greatest effect to the brain while it's growing. No marijuana before 18 gives the greatest possibility for best development (this does not take account of the legal stuff!). With alcohol, the older your son is before he consumes more than 1 unit per hour, the better it is for his brain development. Somewhere between 18 and 21 this is no longer applicable. While it's incredibly difficult to control the use of these as your son gets older, science shows that "less is best"! If your son is younger, perhaps conversations earlier will help later!

Play role scenarios with your teenagers to prepare them for situations that they may not think clearly in at the time. – E.g if you're at a party and someone offers you a drink what will you do

Validate their feelings BEFORE you offer advice.

Finally, the following metaphor was used Matt Bertram (our Headmaster) emphasised in his prize giving speeches.

A packet of popcorn all goes into the pot at the same time, is turned up to the same heat and sits in the same oil but it pops at different times. SO it is with our sons and their journey through adolescence to maturity.

"The brain scan of a five-year-old is very similar to a 15-year-old, that's when all of the activity is happening in the emotional brain. When you're 15 the frontal cortex is shut for renovations, that's why we see rates of anxiety, depression and suicide soaring in the adolescent years. So we just need to be their cortex for them." – Nathan Wallis

## Please read the following if your son will be living away from home in 2020. It may be helpful for you and him!!

The following came to school via the health nurse.

Advisory to High Schools: Eligibility for Free Meningococcal Immunisation

From 1 December 2019, meningococcal ACWY vaccination will be funded for individuals aged 13-25 years (inclusive) in their first year of living in a boarding school hostel, tertiary education hall of residence, military barracks (or prison). There is also a catch-up programme from 1 December 2019 to 30 November 2020 for those aged 13-25 years who are already

in one of these close living situations.

The immunisation is one dose and covers meningococcal strains A,C,W and Y. This is available from the GP practice. For those that may have already had this immunisation, ask at your GP practice if you are eligible for a funded booster – recommended 5 yearly after the first dose if still in a high risk group.

The immunisation does not cover meningococcal strain B. There is an immunisation available to cover this strain, which can be purchased from the GP practice also.


