Growing Individual Success

International students choose Napier Boys' for a variety of reasons. Students come with different goals. Our job is to listen and act on what the student and their family want from their experience. Our goal is to build a personalised programme to suit their unique personality and goals – to foster success.

What sets Napier Boys' International apart is our bespoke programmes. We aim to meet every student and family before they arrive. All students are different, and they come to us for different reasons. We like to learn about

the individual and their family. We listen to what their goal is for their time with us. On arrival we build a programme to scaffold the student to achieve their goals, short or long-term. Then it is about supporting them to meet these goals. What makes us different is this personal support and connection.

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Growing Knowledge

Our learners are all different. They enter our international programme with different abilities, expectations and goals. At Napier Boys' International their genuine success is based on a wide range of experiences. A large state-school, we offer a significant array of subjects and opportunities for boys.

The School resources classes that boys enjoy and see as pathways for future careers. Learning is geared to individual needs. This means our international students build academic programme that fit with their learning goals. These can be short or long-term, or trying something entirely new.

Unique programmes for international students:

Earth and Space Science Napier Boys' is the only school in the Southern Hemisphere to have its own onsite planetarium. Using this facility we offer a unique Earth and Space Science programme.

Engineering Our international students enjoy this handson programme. The course incorporates practical skills with the latest technology, like laser-cutters and 3-D printers.

Digital technology and design begins with all students studying robotics and technology. As students move into the Senior School their options include a creative digital design course or another pathway focused on programming, game design and game development.

Nutrition, hospitality, viticulture and agriculture Our region is famous for tourism and primary produce. Many of our students go onto careers in the primary and tourism sector, including agribusiness, hotel management, tourism operators and the wine industry. Our programme is unique, with onsite gardens, vineyard and a commercial kitchen.

Social Sciences are strong at the School and involve a lot of learning outside the classroom. In the past decade we have topped New Zealand for Scholarship Economics and had the most students gain Scholarship Geography.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

We offer an exclusive class for international ESOL learners. Our class is small, with up to 10 international students, and offers academic and IELT support.

Athlete Development Programme

Napier Boys' High School remains one of New Zealand's leading sports schools. Our Athlete Development Programme, running from Year 9, is a high-performance programme aimed at developing athletes to reach the top of their respective sports.

Growing From Sport: Packages

Bespoke short-stay sports packages can be organised on request for most sports. Here are two popular options.

Rugby Package

Napier Boys' remains one of the nation's leading rugby nurseries, producing numerous international players. The schoolwide rugby philosophy is, 'better young men make better rugby players'.

Under the direction of a former NZ Rugby and Heineken Cup coach, the programme runs throughout the year. The main rugby season is May through August. International students can play rugby at any level. Some have never played before, but for others it is a pathway to higher honours.

Packages are tailor-made to suit individuals or groups, short or long-term stay. Combinations include weekly training and games with a school team through specialised technical, tactical, strength and conditioning, mental skills, nutrition and leadership sessions.

Golf Package

Whatever your level, golf is an extremely popular and cheap option for international students. Our proximity - 10 minutes from the school campus - to the Maraenui Golf Club makes golfing easy. Students play for the club and school. The school team, consistently ranked in the country's top ten, plays local inter-school, Super 8 and national division fixtures. Beginners take advantage of specialist training at school during lunch and at the club. Coaching is provided by a qualified AAA Class NZPGA TPI and Junior TPI specialist.

Short-stay packages for small groups are arranged on request. This can involve a combination of golf, aspects of +PLUS and ESOL or regular classes. We can even add golf tours, visiting cities and courses across New Zealand. But nothing beats playing the local Cape Kidnappers course, ranked in the top 50 worldwide.






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Growing from Culture and Creativity

Our Place

Our place, our school facilities, are extensive and impressive. Our campus is 30 hectares. For most international students this is unimaginable.

Located two-minutes from the Pacific Ocean we have grounds unrivaled in New Zealand. The site includes modern learning spaces, pavilions, all-weather hockey and tennis facilities, a large swimming complex, extensive sports fields, commercial kitchen, music suite, Scinde House dormitories, adjacent farm, Holt Planetarium and New Zealand's first school vineyard. Additionally, the school has an outdoor education facility, Camp Simmons, located in Kaweka Forest Park.

A Nurturing Home

Great accommodation is a critical component of a successful international experience. Again, we apply our bespoke philosophy. We listen to the interests and needs of the international student and find the best fit with our accommodation options. This is what makes us different the personal touch.

Homestay

Most international students prefer to live with a New Zealand family. This is a great way to experience kiwi culture and family life. Not all homestay families are the same. Some have a particular interest or passion. However, all homestay families are carefully selected, vetted and have a common interest in providing a safe, welcoming and caring home environment.

Boarding

Napier Boys' High School has the largest onsite boarding hostel in New Zealand, with 190 beds. Scinde House was opened in 1885. Today, it is a modern, vibrant and exceptionally managed facility. Boarding has advantages. The structured system suits some young men. For others it is an opportunity to live with their peers and have easy access to training and games after class.
