What is NCEA?

NCEA is the National Certificate in Educational Achievement.


NBHS offers courses where there are standards from Levels 1 to 4. Courses offered could have:

- Internally and/or Externally assessed standards
- Achievement and/or Unit standards
- Literacy or Numeracy tagged standards

Standards are allocated a certain number of credits depending on the weighting of work assigned to the standard. In the NCEA refresh, there are fewer standards, but they are worth more credits.

NCEA requirements

- Standards-based
- Assessment standards include
 - Achievement Standards: NZC/TMOA
 - Unit Standards: workrelated skills
 - Skills Standards: workrelated skills



- At each level, students must achieve at least 80 credits to gain an NCEA certificate.
- Credits can be gained over more than 1 year.
- The NCEA co-requisite is a required measure of competency in literacy and numeracy.

Achieving NCEA in 2024 and 2025 = 80 credits


During the current year, internal (IN) results will only show when they have been reported to NZQA.

External (EX) results appear after results release in January. Click on an external standard to see your assessed work.

Check that your entry details are correct:

- Are the standards listed?
- Do they need to be translated into Māori?
- Are the entries Digital?

Government Policy has now paused the intended changes to align with the new curriculum rollout.



What is our school doing?

 We know that many schools have reconsidered their approach to Level 1 NCEA.

These are the changes we have made:

- Designing courses that allow teachers to assess all subject learning by offering all standards.
- Assessing students at Year 10 for their Numeracy and Literacy co-requisite
- Ensuring students who do not meet the Numeracy and/or Literacy standard in Year 10 are offered additional support in Year 11.

How the co-requisite works...

A STUDENT NEEDS TO HAVE 10 CREDITS IN NUMERACY AND LITERACY TO BE ABLE TO ACHIEVE LEVEL 1 OVERALL.

Gaining Endorsements

NCEA certificates can be endorsed with Merit or Excellence.

To achieve an Excellence endorsement, a student must earn 50 credits at Excellence. Those credits must be at the level of the certificate or above.

To achieve a Merit endorsement, a student must earn 50 credits at Merit (or Merit and Excellence)

Gaining Course Endorsements

Students achieve course endorsement if, in a single school year, they achieve:

14 or more credits at Achieved or Merit or Excellence, and at least 3 credits from externally assessed standards and 3 credits from internally assessed standards. (Excluding PE)

Subject selection and Course Planning

The school is supporting your son with his Subject selection and Course Planning by doing the following:

<u>Discussions with his Tutor</u> - The tutor will have access to his current courses and how he is performing in them.

Discussions with his Dean – The dean may have a different perspective, but has the same access as the Tutor.

Using the school's Career Counsellor – The CC will know the course required for intended future pathways.




Subject selection and Course Planning

- 2. Exploring with your son the online tools to help support him in his decision making.
- 3. Using friends or extended family members to provide guidance (potential shadow days).
